Brethren all – FYI: DUES INCREASE! Be informed in advance of the dues increase for 2019. The delegates to the 2017 Grand Annual Communication voted and approved a \$10. increase for the “Grand Lodge portion” of dues of all Subordinate Lodges, effective January 1, 2019. Accordingly, our Lodge dues must increase \$10. So, our Lodge annual dues for 2019 will be \$117. The next dues notice you receive, mailed to you in November, will indicate this amount.
